EXHIBITORS WILL BE DEEMED TO HAVE READ AND COMPLIED WITH THE FOLLOWING:

Compliance with Society's Health and Safety Regulations is a condition of entry. Any exhibitor failing to observe these precautions will be refused entry to their classes, or will forfeit any prize money gained and be asked to leave the showground. It is recommended that riding hats / skull caps to current standards are worn at all times when mounted or leading a horse or pony. Where societies insist on their members wearing these types of hats during competition this rule will be strictly enforced.

Rosettes will be awarded to all competitors in Lead Rein and First Ridden Classes.

All competitors MUST comply with directions from Car Parking Marshalls.

The Committee will adhere as closely as possible to the published schedule and programme, but reserve the right to make any necessary alterations – such as amalgamation of classes if entries should warrant such action. Where it is specified in the schedule that the classes may be split if sufficient entries are received, the decision will be made after the closing date of entries. The committee reserve the right to refuse entries and entries received after the closing date will be returned.

THERE WILL BE NO LATE ENTRY FACILITY THIS YEAR AND ENTRIES CLOSE ON 1st JUNE 2017
No entries will be accepted without the entry fees and no telephone entries will be permitted.

The Judges named in the schedule have consented and have been appointed to act as judge in the classes indicated. The committee reserve the right to appoint substitutes for any who may be unavoidably prevented from attending and all entries are accepted on that understanding.

No claim can be entertained for anything that may happen to competitors, spectators, their property, servants or livestock in connection with, or arising out of this show. It shall be considered a condition of entry that each competitor shall agree to indemnify the organisers against any legal action arising from any accident. Exhibitors will be expected to meet any fees for Veterinary attention of Farrier's which may be charged at the time.

Objections shall be made in writing with the objector's full name and address within one hour of the event concerned and lodged with the Horse Section Secretary's Office, together with the sum of £25 Deposit. The sum shall be returned if the objection is sustained, but if the objection is not sustained, after consideration by at least three members of the committee, the deposit shall be forfeited.

Stallions and colts are only permitted to enter the classes designated for them in the schedule and must be kept under strict control at all times.

Three year old fillies with foals at foot are not eligible for the Brood Mare or Youngstock Classes. Foals must be at least four weeks old on the day of the show.

Any horse / pony deemed by the Judge / Steward to be dangerous to other horses / ponies / spectators will be asked to leave the Show Ground. Please consult any member of the Horse Section Committee if you require any advice.

PLEASE NOTE THAT NO THETHERING OF HORSES / PONIES WILL BE ALLOWED.

All hunter / sports horse classes will be judged under the societies rules and SHB (GB) require all entries in the hunter classes to be registered. Classes 1, 3 and 4 are qualifying events for the RHIS 2018. The three highest placed horses in Class 1 will qualify no horse lower than 3rd in its class will qualify. In classes 3 and 4 the two highest placed smalls and the 2 highest placed lightweights will qualify and in the heavy weight section the 2 highest placed middle weights and 2 highest placed heavy weights will qualify.

Only horses on the 2017 show hunter register are eligible to enter registration numbers must be quoted in the entry form and owners and riders must be full members of the society.

Day tickets = £30 (this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 1 show per year. It covers owner and rider membership together with the horse registration for that show. Horses in class 2 are only required to be registered on the basic identity record or stud book of the society.

No horse may be entered in a ridden hunter, working show horse class or riding horse class at the same show. This does not apply to working hunter or sports horse classes.

Working hunter courses are not to be walked by competitors until the judge has given permission.

There will be a change of course between the open, restricted, novice and amateur classes.

Any horse which has qualified as a grade A show jumper or advanced event horse at 1st January 2017 is not eligible to compete in working hunter classes.

THE MAXIMUM TOTAL POINTS AVAILABLE IS 100 – THIS IS MADE UP OF: JUMPING POINTS = MAXIMUM 40 POINTS STYLE AND PRECENCE WHILST JUMING = MAX 20 POINTS. RIDE = MAX 20 POINTS. CONFORMATION = 20 POINTS. HORSES WITH MINUS SCORES MAY NOT BE REQUIRED FOR THE SECOND PHASE OF THE CLASS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE JUDGE. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD A HORSE WITH A MINUS SCORE BE IN A QUALIFICATION POSITION. FENCES TO BE A MINUMIM OF 8 AND A MAXIMUM OF 12 IN NUMBER. OPEN CLASS MAXIMUM HEIGHT 3’9” (1.14M) NOVICE MINUMUM HEIGHT 2’9” (.085M) MAXIMUM 3’3” (1M)

Working hunters may compete or concur in novice and restricted working hunter classes in the jumping phase only, at the discretion of the show secretary but the horse can't compete in any working hunter class for the duration of the show. All obstacles are numbered. Fences should have a natural presence and not be easily dislodged. The manner of going to be taken into account. No change of rider or tack will be allowed (Unless a horse is ridden side saddle, in which case in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only).

Horses may be equipped with boots of a plain colour in the jumping phase only, rigid or weighted boots are not allowed nor hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class. On completion of the jumping phase ALL CLEAR ROUNDS and any other horses the judge may require should be asked to return to the ring. If a horse jumps an incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Horses displaying continued disobedience or leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted will be eliminated. In the event of a horse falling during a class that horse will be asked to leave the ring and will not be allowed to compete further in that class.

Exhibitors will be allowed to compete 2 horses in a working hunter class but following the jumping phase it will be up to the exhibitor to select only one horse to be taken forward in to the ridden conformation section if required.

1. RIHS Open Working hunter mare / gelding or stallion (Competing stallions must wear a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) 4 years and over exceeding 148cm (14.2HH approx)

Horses must not have won more than 5 BE points or 200 BS points at home or equivalent abroad before the 1.1.2017.

AMATEUR RIDER CLASSES

AMATEUR STAUS

A person is an amateur for showing purposes when showing ridden hunter in an amateur class if he or she does not :

Engage on livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses as a means of deriving a main source of income since 1st January 2014

Accept remuneration whether it is monetary or goods in kind for employment in connection with horses in a racing, showing, livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony club or riding club excepted) since 1st January 2015

Show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm or a horse for which his or her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate concern since the 1st January 2015
Show a horse which a professional rider has ridden on any ridden hunter or sports horse class during the current year unless the horse has subsequently re registered under a new ownership, with the exception of working hunter and ladies hunter classes.

Professional show persons must not enter the amateur ring whilst the class is in progress professional show person is another term for a professional producer and as such a professional groom who works for a producer can enter the ring to groom

A professional rider must not ride or exercise an amateur horse on the day it is competing in the amateur classes

These classes are affiliated to the British Skewbald and Piebald Association and are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show Hickstead 2018. Classes will be judged under BSPA rules.

Download from www.bspaonline.com all horses / ponies must be registered and all owners and riders BSPA members prior to the show. Riders age taken from 1st January. Membership and qualification cards must be carried in the ring by the competitors and produced as required for inspection or signature. Failure to do so will mean disqualification. Spurs may not be worn in any pony class.

Ponies 153cm or under (Shetlands exempt) must possess a current JMB height certificate. ID card and wear BSPA Stallion ID disc. No rider under 14 may exhibit a stallion in any class.

No competitor. Owner/ horse may compete in this class or enter the ring without current 2017 membership of BSPA and a RIHS qualification card.

Qualification: 1st place and the next unqualified competitor standing 2nd or 3rd qualify from each class, no competitor may qualify from lower than 3rd place. BSPA 01354 638226 bspashows@aol.com

All stallions 4 years and over must be graded licensed and registered with BSPA or in possession of a 2017 BSPA Stallion Showing Permit (Contact BSPA for stallion showing permit information) in order to compete, and must carry into the ring their red BSPA showing ID card & BSPA bridle discs to be worn. In order to qualify all owners / handlers/ riders must be members of the BSPA and all horses / ponies registered with the BSPA prior to the show.

BSPA qualification cards must be produced in the ring and be signed by the judge, otherwise qualification is invalid. The highest placed amateur and highest placed junior in each class (Must be members of BSPA) will qualify for the amateur and junior supreme championship finals to be held at the BSPA World of Colour Championship Show 10th September 2017 The College |EC, Keyside Beds Amateur / Junior cards to be shown and qualification card signed. Qualification 1 – 3 in all classes or 1 - 4 in classes exceeding 10.
